



### **AMC Domestic Scholar Award - 2022**

The AIDS Malignancy Consortium (AMC) is pleased to announce that it is currently accepting applications for the AMC Scholar (fellowship) program. The scholar program was established to encourage and foster the development of new and junior clinical investigators to pursue careers in clinical research in HIV-associated malignancies within the context of the AMC. Applicants must hold a medical degree (such as a Doctor of Medicine (MD), Doctor of Osteopathy (DO), or Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery (MB, ChB, MB BS, BM MCh, etc.)) or a PhD/DrPH in population science (e.g., epidemiology, biostatistics, health outcomes & behavior). Additionally, applicants must be either completing a mentored fellowship (e.g., clinical fellowship, postdoctoral fellowship) or be junior faculty within 10 years of joining the faculty at an AMC site. Preference will be given to fellows in training or new faculty just beginning a research career in HIV malignancies. Awards will be for one or two years (second year dependent on demonstration of adequate progress and participation in AMC activities in the first year). These awards are designed to allow the individuals to participate in the scientific and clinical trials aspects of the AMC. Scholars should have an interest area of clinical research in AIDS malignancies. Fellows must have the endorsement of the local site AMC PI and a designated clinical research mentor who will supervise the awardee. A letter from the research mentor outlining the course of study and how it will focus on the study of HIV-related cancers must accompany the application and will be part of the evaluation and selection process. Assurance must be given that the awardee will be provided sufficient protected time to pursue research and to participate in AMC activities. Mentors should also provide assurance that they will meet regularly with and provide guidance to the individual during the course of the award. Guidance and ongoing interaction with the mentor are critical to the learning process and successful completion of the selected project. Applicants are encouraged to confer with and include a mentor/mentors from outside their institution in addition to a local investigator. The Directors of the AMC Career Enhancement Program are available for consultation and assistance with identifying an additional mentor. The applicant must also outline a project to be worked on during the first year of the fellowship. Direct funds up to \$25,000 per year will be awarded to the applicant's institution for the benefit of the awardee's training and participation in AMC activities. Funds may be used towards the scholar's salary or other educational or research needs. Awardees will be required to attend the AMC Group Investigators' meetings which are held twice each year, with travel costs paid by the AMC group for in-person meetings, to present their research projects during the AMC Scholars' Symposium (during in person and virtual meetings), and to participate in career development sessions led by the AMC Scholars Directors. Scholars are also encouraged to participate in protocol team and Working Group discussions, as appropriate. A progress report will be required from the fellow prior to the end of the first year of support and at the conclusion of the second year. Review will be performed by the AMC Executive Committee.
