



AMC Lab/Translational Fellowship Program - 2020

The AIDS Malignancy Consortium (AMC) is pleased to announce that we are accepting applications for the AMC fellowship program. The purpose of these awards is to encourage and foster new, junior investigators to pursue careers in AIDS malignancies and to work with the AMC in expanding its translational research portfolio. Applicants must hold a PhD, MD or MD/PhD degree(s) and be a research fellow, research investigator or junior faculty member within 3 years of joining the faculty at an AMC site. Fellowships will be for one or two years (second year dependent on demonstration of adequate progress and participation in AMC activities in the first year). These fellowships are designed to allow the fellow to participate in the scientific and translational research activities related to AMC clinical trials. Fellows may have interest in any laboratory based research area as it relates to AIDS malignancies. Fellows must have the endorsement of the local AMC site PI and a designated research mentor who will supervise the awardee. A letter from the research mentor outlining the course of study and how it will focus on the study of HIV-related cancers must accompany the application and will be part of the evaluation and selection process. The applicant must also outline a project to be worked on during the first year of the fellowship. Direct funds up to \$25,000 per year will be awarded to the applicant's institution for the benefit of the fellow's training and participation in AMC activities. Funds may be used towards the fellow's salary or other educational or research needs. Fellows will be required to attend the AMC Group Investigators' meetings which are held twice each year, with travel costs paid by the AMC for in person meetings, to present their research project during the AMC Fellows' Symposium (during in person and virtual meetings) and participate in career development sessions led by the AMC Fellowship Directors. Fellows are also encouraged to participate in protocol team and Working Group discussions, as appropriate. A progress report will be required from the fellow prior to the end of the first year of support and at the conclusion of the second year. Review will be performed by the AMC Executive Committee.

Application forms are available and will be accepted once per year.

Deadline Date for 2019-20 Applications: July 24, 2020

Announcement of Awardees: August 28, 2020

Award will be made for one year with start date of September 1, 2020 to coincide with the AMC fiscal year.
